This cookie notice explains how Cooley LLP and our affiliates (“Cooley,” “firm,” “we,” “us” or “our”) use cookies, pixel tags, HTML5 local storage/local shared objects, and other equivalent tracking technologies (collectively, “cookies”) on our websites that link to this cookie notice, as well as in our emails, and your related choices.

Managing your preferences

You can manage your preferences for how we use cookies at any time through our [Cookie Preference Center](#).

You may opt out of and/or block the use of our cookies. However, if you do so, you may not be able to access all or parts of our websites and may experience some inconvenience in your use of our websites. For example, we may not be able to recognize your device.

Types of cookies and technologies Cooley uses

We may use any or all of the technologies listed below on our websites and in our emails.

Cookies

A cookie is a very small text file that may be placed on your browser or in storage on your device. There are two types: “session cookies” and “persistent cookies.”

- Session cookies disappear from your device or browser when you close your browser.
- Persistent cookies stay on your device even after you close your browser.

Please note that Cooley and third-party service providers may set cookies on our websites – these “third-party cookies” are set by domains other than those we control, and they may recognize your device across different websites.

Pixel tags

A pixel tag is a single pixel, transparent GIF image with a unique identifier that can recognize certain types of data on your device (similar to cookies). Pixel tags are used to operate and improve the websites and our email practices, including to help deliver cookies, count visits, and understand usage and email campaign effectiveness.

For example, we may put pixel tags on emails to understand how you interact with that email, including whether you opened the email, whether you forwarded it, and whether you clicked on a link in the email that directed you to our websites. These pixels also may collect the time, location, and operating system of the device you use to read the email.

Other similar technologies

We may use other tracking technologies, such as mobile advertising IDs and tags, and HTML5 local storage/local shared objects (which store relevant data locally on your device), for similar purposes as described in this cookie notice.

Why Cooley uses cookies and other technologies

Our use of cookies and other technologies may fall into one of the following categories.

- **Strictly necessary cookies:** These cookies are essential in order to enable our websites to provide the function

you have requested, such as helping ensure that the content of a page loads quickly and effectively.

- **Functional cookies:** These cookies allow us to provide enhanced personalization and functionality, such as tailoring content to you, remembering your choices and preferences on the websites (e.g., language, text size, etc.), or remembering search parameters.
- **Performance cookies:** These cookies collect information on how users interact with our websites and enable us to improve how our websites operate and our business more widely.
- **Targeting cookies:** These cookies collect information about your browsing habits in order to provide advertising that is more relevant to you and your interests – for example, they remember the websites you have visited and share that information with other parties such as advertising technology service providers.
